My degree is an MSW from The University of Georgia awarded in March 1988. I was licensed in Georgia as an LCSW from 1992-1999. I was licensed in Colorado as an LCSW in 2000 and maintain this license each year. In addition I have been Certified as an Imago Relationship Therapist since 1991. In 1998 I was certified by The American Board of Hypnotherapy as a Spiritual Counselor.

The Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies has the general responsibility of regulating the practice of licensed psychologists, licensed social workers, licensed professional counselors, licensed marriage and family therapists, licensed school psychologists practicing outside the school setting, and unlicensed individuals who practice psychotherapy.

The agency within the Department that has responsibility specifically for licensed and unlicensed psychotherapists is the Department of Regulatory Agencies, Mental Health Section, 1560 Broadway, Suite #1340, Denver, Colorado 80202, (303) 894-7766.

**CLIENT RIGHTS AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

- A. You are entitled to receive information from me about my methods of therapy, the techniques I use, the duration of your therapy (if I can determine it), and my fee structure. Please ask if you would like to receive this information.
- B. You can seek a second opinion from another therapist or terminate therapy at any time. I generally recommend that you have at least one final session for closure when you are clear that you would like to stop your therapy. This supports the best of endings and helps anchor in the gains you've made in therapy.
- C. In a professional relationship (such as ours), sexual intimacy between a therapist and a client is never appropriate. If sexual intimacy occurs, it should be reported to the Department of Regulatory Agencies, Mental Health Section
- D. Generally speaking, the information provided by and to a client during therapy sessions is legally confidential if the therapist is a licensed marriage and family therapist, a licensed social worker, a licensed professional counselor, a licensed psychologist, or an unlicensed psychotherapist. If the information is legally confidential, the therapist cannot be forced to disclose the information without the client's consent.

Information disclosed to a licensed marriage and family therapist, a licensed social worker, a licensed professional counselor, a licensed psychologist, or an unlicensed psychotherapist is privileged communication and cannot be disclosed in any court of competent jurisdiction in the State of Colorado without the consent of the person to whom the testimony sought relates.

There are exceptions to the general rule of legal confidentiality. These exceptions are listed in the Colorado statutes (C.R.S. 12-43-218). For example, I must, by law, report child abuse.
